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#### STUDENTS RIGHT TO CANCEL

- 1. An applicant requesting cancellation within three days after signing an enrollment agreement and making an initial payment is entitled to a refund of all monies paid by the applicant per accreditation standards. Otherwise, the institution shall refund 100 percent of the amount paid for institutional charges less than a reasonable registration fee not to exceed seventy-five dollars (\$75) if notice of cancellation is made before the seventh class day after enrollment, whichever is the latter.
- 2. Cancellation shall occur when you give written notice at the school address shown on the front page of the Enrollment Agreement. You can do this by mail, hand delivery, or email. If sent by mail, written notice of cancellation is effective as of the post-date received. The written notice of cancellation does not need to take any particular form. You will be given a form upon enrollment, but you may use any written notice to inform the School of your cancellation.
- 3. If the School has given you any textbooks, equipment, or supplies, you shall return them to the School in unopened/unused condition within 7 days following the date of the notice of cancellation. If you fail to return equipment or supplies to the School within this period, you may be charged the documented cost for the equipment or supplies. Once you pay for the equipment or supplies, it is yours to keep without further obligation.
- 4. If you cancel this agreement within the specified time, the School will refund all payments, less any deduction for non-refundable items and opened/used books & supplies, within 7 days after your cancelation notice.
- 5. The institution shall also provide a pro-rata refund of nonfederal student financial aid program money paid for institutional charges to students who have completed 60 percent or less of the period of attendance.

#### WITHDRAWING AFTER THE FIRST SEVEN DAYS FOLLOWING THE FIRST CLASS

- 1. You have the right to withdraw from the course at any time.
- 2. If you withdraw from the course after midnight of the seventh day, the School will calculate the amount you owe for the time you attended according to the formula below.
- 3. The amount you owe shall be determined on a pro-rata basis depending on the clock, hours attended, and amount paid. After calculation of the amount you owe for the time you attended, we will deduct non-refundable items and opened/used books & supplies that you received. For a list of the amounts charged see the list on the front of the Enrollment agreement. Refunds will be calculated from the last date of attendance.



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#### **Definitions**

"Number of Students Who Began the Program" means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.

"Students Available for Graduation" is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.

"Number of On-time Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.

"On-time Completion Rate" is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.

"150% Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).

"150% Completion Rate" is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.

"Graduates Available for Employment" means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.

"Graduates Unavailable for Employment" means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, and are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.

"Graduates employed in the Field" means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six-month period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.



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"Placement Rate Employed in the Field" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.

"Number of Graduates Taking Exam" is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.

"First Available Exam Date" is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.

"Passage Rate" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.

"Number Who Passed First Available Exam" is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.

"Salary" is as reported by graduate or graduate's employer.

"No Salary Information Reported" is the number of graduates for whom; after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.
